The St. George Singers were formed in 1979.

At that time St. George School in East Bristol was one of the largest comprehensive schools in the city. The school had a thriving music department that alongside instrumental groups, including a steel band boasted a choir of some five – hundred pupils. Every year a concert was held in the Colston Hall to showcase the school and it's music. At this event ex – pupils were invited back to sing with the school choir. After a rehearsal for one of these events a group of some twenty ex – pupils decided that they would like to meet more often than once a year. St.

George Singers was conceived.

Over the years many things have changed. The choir no longer recruits from just the East Bristol area. The choir now has over forty singers. Two things however have not changed. The choir is funded by it's members. No – one takes any fees or expenses for work carried out on behalf of the choir. All money raised for the various good causes we support goes straight to that charity. Over the last forty years tens of thousands of pounds have been raised for both local and international charities.
